In the backdrop of National Initiative to become 5 Trillion Economy and Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav, an initiative of the Government of India and to celebrate and commemorate 75 years of progressive India and glorious history of its people, culture and achievement, **Indian Institute of Corporate Affairs (Ministry of Corporate Affairs), Manufacturers Association of Faridabad (MFA) & Indian European Chamber of Small & Medium Enterprises (IECSME) organised – MSME National Summit with Tagline - “Sankalp for Gearing up Udhya Mitra Vikas for stronger India & 5 Trillion Economy”** evolving around the Theme - **“Let us Join Hands, Rejuvenate & Realign our Vibes and commitment for building Saksham and Samarth Vishwaguru Bharat to lead the global fraternity”** on 10th December, 2021 at Auditorium, SDIET, Faridabad, (Haryana), Time : 10:00 am to 5.30 pm.

The summit witnessed active participation of delegates from leading chambers of commerce and industry as well as participants of specialised Consultancy Organizations located across the country.

Given the backdrop and the recent momentum seen in various aspects of Indian MSME Sector, this summit assumed critical importance as it has given a platform for exchanging ideas and also an opportunity to get the perspectives on focus areas of MSME Sector, its importance for the Indian Economy and what may be the road ahead for India. The summit also focuses on preparation of a clearly defined roadmap on the important issues of the MSME development agenda in India.

global fraternity”, the deliberation focused on preparation of clearly defined roadmap for “Creating CEOs for Rural India” with “Conceptualizing Vision Path from Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav of 75th Independence Day to 100th Independence Day 2047” to become Vishwa Guru Bharat.

A conceptual note for establishment of Micro & Small Enterprises (MSE) Growth Centres - captioned as Poly-Skill-Mat-Growth Centres/Enterprise Growth Centres - one in a cluster of ten villages-in an institutional set up- under the aegis of the Ministry of MSME, was prepared and developed which is premised on:

- a) Imparting in-house skills & training for an identified-talented local youth-*one hundred per centre*- in their formative age / stage, with a balanced combination of class-room and vocational/on-job training, in focussed MSE areas, together with knowledge betterment and connectivity inputs in a class-room atmosphere.
- b) The training model was suggested as Extension of the trained in the value-addition of material by ‘lending technology and talent’ at the door-step of the locals within an entrepreneurial canvass.

The Conceptual note was conceived in the backdrop of the integrated emphasis of the ‘Skill-India’ ethos with the ‘made-in India’ syndrome, envisioned by Hon’ble Prime Minister and his reported advice for a *certification system* for the skills. Thus the objective, inter-alia covers potential for assured employment; intended to epitomize the dictum (योग: कर्मसु कौशलर्ः). ‘Skill is the bestowment for Development’ which can be established from the following understandings:-

It has been viewed during deliberation that Youth, in the age group of 15-24 yrs., account for an increasing share in the population profile of the country and their role/ participation in the growth process needs no emphasis. Thus efforts for attraction to the young with a career graph and of channelization of *youth power* into the mainstream of development would obviously require structured interventions. One of such interventions could be seen in the facilitation of a vibrant and inherently-skilled and visible youth-power-infrastructure with a T-T-T (Technology, Training and Transfer of skills to growth formation) approach- the prime-stay and focus of the scheme.

The complimentary character of the MSEs as ancillary and cost effective support systems for the large industries is established. The same has a large canvass starting from making a ‘uniform’ for workers (in large industries) up to and above the making of important support systems such as the T&P items and extending into contract management areas such as networking of tool-Room infrastructure. Efforts for extending such a ancillary support, have been largely bilateral in nature and promotional in character. An organized attempt to improve the depth in quality (in the MSE produce) and its extension and spread into diverse areas would attract and lead to a willing cooperation of the large industry. While the results are obvious, the skilled youth would be at the centre of advantage with enlarged / sustainable openings. Emphasis for the above is inherent in the Conceptualizing Vision Path for creating CEOs for Rural India.

In the above context, It has been viewed that MSEs can promote employment generation. Its sustenance would greatly depend upon continuous skill up-gradation through technology adaptability.

Summit Flow:

The summit started with opening remarks by Mr. Rajesh Batra, Head- Centre for MSME /IP&CC, IICA. He addressed participants from leading chambers of commerce and industry specialised Consultancy Organizations. He also congratulated co-organizers for associating with IICA for such an initiative.
